Summer Camp 2022

Spanish Camp: June 13-17, Señora DePilla

Señora DePilla will continue full immersion Spanish through a fun and engaging Spanish camp this summer. We will continue with conversational Spanish, we'll incorporate outdoor activities and movement, and create traditional cultural projects as well.

Master Chef: June 20- 24, Señora DePilla

A week of fun AND learning in the kitchen. Students will learn to prepare complete meals while developing skills like baking, chopping, peeling, balanced menus, food processors, etc.... In addition, after their internship as sous-chefs, they will have a cook-off competition to see which team can prepare the best meal with a given set of ingredients. Children receive an apron and chef's hat that they decorate at the beginning of camp and take home.

Rhythm and Dance Camp: June 27-July 1st, Mrs. Pool

We've got rhythm, yes we do! We've got rhythm, how about you?! Dance along with Mrs. Pool in this one week camp where students will learn dance appreciation, observe performances, and learn choreography set to fun and upbeat music. Dancing teaches how to move to a steady beat, coordination, and develops muscle memory important for the brain body connection. Wear comfortable clothes, lace up your gym shoes and get ready to move!

Jump Rope Camp: July 5- 8th, Mrs. Pool

Jumping rope can help improve coordination, foot-speed, agility, and timing all while having fun! Campers will learn individual rope tricks, long rope techniques, and group choreography. Each camper is challenged at their own pace, and camp is open to kids of any skill level – from beginners to advanced.

Performance Camp/Video Editing: July 11-15th, Mr. Francavilla and Mrs. Pool

Join Mr. Francavilla for a week of performing and learning the basics of editing as we work together to create and perform theatrical and musical works. We will plan, rehearse, and film our projects, and then learn basics in video and audio editing as we work together to produce videos of our creations.

Writing Camp: July 18-22, Mr. Doyle/(1st-3rd), Mrs. Wesenberg (4th-6th)

This camp is a time to unleash your imagination and discover the writer within! With the help of Mr. Doyle and Mrs. Wesenberg, students will also develop their literacy skills, build confidence, and embrace creativity as they explore their individual style.

There will be trivia games, projects, presentations, and an in-depth study of characters, genres, plots, settings, and different Elements of Fiction.
